

National Pharmaceutical Association Awards

- ✓ **All nominees must be active members of NPhA.**
- ✓ **All awards can be self-nominated.**
- ✓ **Nominees can only be selected for one award per year.**
- ✓ **Once an award has been received, the recipient is no longer eligible for the same award.**

Chauncey I. Cooper Award

Established to honor the founder of the National Pharmaceutical Association, the Chauncey I. Cooper Award recognizes sustained and distinguished service to the profession of pharmacy. This is the highest honor awarded by NPhA. The recipient of this award is no longer eligible for other NPhA awards.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a licensed pharmacy practitioner who has been in the profession for a minimum of fifteen (15) years.
- The recipient must be a sustained member of NPhA for at least 10 years.
- The recipient must have made significant contributions to NPhA and the pharmacy profession.
- The recipient must have served in a leadership role within NPhA or another national pharmacy association.
- The recipient must be committed to serving the underserved and dedicated to representing the views and ideals of minority pharmacists on critical issues affecting healthcare and pharmacy.

James N. Tyson Award

Established to honor the longtime educator and first executive director of NPhA, the James N. Tyson Award recognizes outstanding performance and achievements of an individual for contributions made to the National Pharmaceutical Association as well as to the profession of pharmacy.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a licensed pharmacy practitioner who has been in the profession for a minimum of fifteen (15) years.
- The nominee must have shown outstanding performance and achievements for voluntary contributions to the NPhA and the pharmacy profession.
- The recipient must be a current pharmacy academician (Full Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant Professor/Dean) and affiliated



with an accredited college or school of pharmacy.

- The recipient must have had an academic pharmacy faculty appointment for at least 10 years.

Wendell T. Hill Award

Established to honor the longtime Dean of Howard University, College of Pharmacy and Past President of the National Pharmaceutical Association, the Wendell T. Hill Award recognizes the outstanding Zone Director of the year.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a Zone Director who has made significant contributions to NPhA in this role.
- The recipient must have increased membership within their zone by at least 10% over the most recent fiscal year.
- The recipient must have directed professional and community programs within their respective zone.

York Garrett Award

Established to honor the longtime member and Past President of the National Pharmaceutical Association, the York Garrett Award recognizes contributions to community pharmacy as an owner or manager and significant improvements in the provision of pharmaceutical care while a member of NPhA.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a licensed community pharmacist who has been a pharmacy owner or manager.
- The recipient must have demonstrated an innovative approach that has advanced community pharmacy practice.
- The recipient must serve as a preceptor to pharmacy students of an accredited college or school of pharmacy.



Terrence Burroughs Pharmacy Leadership Award

Established to honor the longtime member of the National Pharmaceutical Association, the Terrence Burroughs Pharmacy Leadership Award recognizes contributions to the profession through involvement at both the local and national levels. Terrence Burroughs or his designee will review each nominee for input prior to the final selection.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must serve as a role model in volunteer community leadership and demonstrate commitment to serving the underserved community.

Health-Systems Practitioner Award

The Health-Systems Practitioner Award recognizes contributions to the health-systems pharmacy as a staff pharmacist or manager with significant improvements in the provision of pharmaceutical care while a member of NPhA.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a licensed health-systems pharmacist who has been a staff pharmacist, clinical pharmacist or manager/director.
- The recipient must have demonstrated an innovative approach that has helped advance pharmacy practice within a health-system.

Young Pharmacist Award

The Young Pharmacist Award recognizes eager and effective participation in the affairs of NPhA and contributions to the pharmacy profession.

Eligibility:

- The recipient must be a licensed pharmacy practitioner for no more than 5 years.
- The recipient must have participated in local and/or national NPhA activities.
- The recipient must have displayed dedication to the future of pharmacy through leadership and professional activities.

Chapter of the Year Award

This award recognizes the financial, active Chapter that has best promoted the mission of NPhA in the community it serves.
